## Adopted by the Red Roof Inns, St. Clair Shores & Warren

This Lockheed-built two-place trainer was originally intended to train pilots to fly jets. The T-33 is a derivative of the P-80 which was the Air Force's first operational jet fighter. The T-33 aircraft was flown at Selfridge by the 56<sup>th</sup> FG and 1<sup>st</sup> FW from 1960 to 1969 and by Michigan ANG units at Detroit Metropolitan Airport and Selfridge from 1953 to 1987. T-33 #53-6099 was donated by the Air Force to a flying club in Caro, Michigan and airlifted to Selfridge. This aircraft has been repainted to represent T-33 flown by the 171<sup>st</sup> Fighter Interceptor Squadron of the Michigan ANG.
