

RF-101C "VooDoo"



Adopted by Cub Scout Pack 90

This reconnaissance version of the F-101 fighter built by McDonnell was the first photo recon aircraft capable of flying faster than the speed of sound (approximately 760 mph at sea level). It saw service in Vietnam, was used to confirm the dismantling of Russian missiles in Cuba at the end of the Cuban missile crisis and was flown by Michigan ANG units at Selfridge from 1971 to 1973. It was returned to Selfridge by the Mississippi ANG in 1979.
